CHL LEAGUE PLAYING RULES

Rule 1: Equal Ice Time

- a. The CHL will operate on the basis of equal ice time for all players during the game played.
- b. In **Major Novice through Juvenile** divisions it is acceptable to play fewer defense pairings than forward lines. In these divisions all forwards should play as equal as possible, and all defensemen should play as equal as possible, with a minimum of two defensive pairings and a maximum of three forward lines. An exception to this would be in the case of a team having less than ten skaters.
- c. In Minor Novice coaches will follow a 5 in 5 out rotation of players, regardless of position (see rule 19 Novice Division).
- d. CHL monitoring of line changes and ice time can take place at any time during the season.
- e. Each association must present a report of games at home arena(s) monitored for 5 in 5 out rule and bring to the October, November and December meetings (minimum).
- f. Failure to adhere to CHL Equal Ice Rules during regular season may result in the suspension of the coach.
- g. Any offense in playoff play or on championship weekend will result in a minimum of a one game suspension. Additional penalties including game forfeiture, two game suspensions, or a season suspension will be considered at the discretion of the League Commissioner and / or the CHL Disciplinary Committee.
- h. If during a game a player on the game sheet, misses playing time, that ice time is not to be made up at the expense of another player's ice time.

Rule 2: HC / OHF / MHAO

The rules and penalties of Hockey Canada, the Ontario Hockey Federation and the Minor Hockey Alliance of Ontario will apply subject to any rules amended by the CHL Board.

Rule 3: Team Structure and Balancing

- a. All teams entered in each division by a member association are to be on a Major/Minor basis.
- b. Associations can transfer players between associations, and associations can move their best players up one level.
- c. All teams within an association are to be balanced. Balancing to be complete by mid November.
- d. In the event of an alleged imbalance, the CHL will notify the offending member association who must respond within seven
 (7) days. If there is no response or an unsatisfactory response is received, the team may be in-eligible for playoffs or moved up a division.
- The CHL will be flexible, re: player movements, to accommodate associations to field competitive teams where player numbers are an issue. Major players could be allowed to play on the minor teams with CHL board approval.

Rule 4: Team Rosters

All teams must follow Alliance Rule Book guidelines for team rosters.
 CHL teams may only make changes to their roster(s) up to December 31 of each year.

Rule 5: Colour Conflict

- Referees will determine if a colour conflict exists
- b. The home team is responsible for avoiding a colour conflict in the body of the team sweaters.
- c. Failure to comply will result in the home team rescheduling.
- d. The associations shall wherever possible avoid having the same colour sweaters in the same division.
- e. Team colours to be submitted by each association to the CHL no later than the October meeting for posting on the website.

Rule 6: Game Officials

- a. The home team will provide a competent timekeeper, referees and an approved game sheet. The visiting team, at their option, may provide the scorekeeper.
- b. All referees must be at least 2 years older than the division age limit.
- c. Two carded Alliance officials shall officiate at all league and playoff games. In the event only one referee shows for a league or playoff game, the visiting team will leave the ice surface and the home team will use the ice for a practice. No game shall start with one referee on the ice. Any coach who plays a game, including an exhibition, on this ice will be subject to a one game suspension and the game will be replayed.
- d. For Bantam divisions, three carded Alliance officials must be scheduled. However, where only two carded officials show up, the game may be played.

Rule 7: Game Sheets

- a. The game may not start until the game sheet is fully completed and approved by the referee.
- The game sheet must be completed by the Home team and given to the Visiting team no less than 15 minutes prior to game time.
- c. Game sheet copies are to be distributed to each teams' coach immediately following the game by the timekeeper.

- d. The **top white copy** of the game sheet must be deposited in the CHL box immediately after the game has been played, except when necessary for the game officials to file a game report. It is the responsibility of the Timekeeper to make sure the top white copy is put into CHL Box.
- e. All tournament game sheets are to be put in the CHL game box within 48 hours after completion of tournament or the coach will be suspended until they are received.
- f. A certified Trainer must be on the game sheet. Failure to have a certified Trainer on the game sheet will result in a suspension to both Head Coaches and the game replayed.
- All penalties must appear on game sheet.
- h. Head coach is responsible for players/coaches to sit out suspension(s) as per OHF minimum suspension list or additional suspensions could be given by Commissioner. Suspensions must be listed on game sheets.

Rule 8: Game Results

- a. The coach of the Home team is to provide the game results to their association for submission, via their ice convener (or designate), into the online system within 48 hours of the scheduled start of the game, regardless of which team won the game.
- b. A game will be considered complete when 25 minutes of the game time has been completed.
- c. All suspended games under 25 minutes will be reviewed by the CHL Board.

Rule 9: Pegging of Nets

- a. Nets will be pegged for all games in all CHL divisions.
- b. All associations are responsible for supplying schedules (for their home games) to arena staff.

Rule 10: Standings

- a. In all league and playoff situations the standings will be determined using this formula.
- b. If two teams are tied in points:
 - b.1. The team with the most points earned in games between the two-tied teams gains the highest position (Head to Head record)
 - b.2. The team with the most total wins against all opponents in the division gains the higher position
 - b.3. If the two teams are still tied after 1 and 2 have been applied then the team with the best goals against average gains the highest position. The goal average is to be determined by the following method:
 - b.3.1. Divide the total number of goals "for" and "against" into the total goals "for"
 - b.3.2. The team with the highest percentage takes the highest position
 - b.4. If the two teams are still tied after 1, 2 and 3 have been applied then a 1 game sudden victory game will be arranged between the two teams. A coin toss will determine which team has home ice advantage.
- c. If three or more teams are tied:
 - c.1. The team with the most wins against all opponents in the division would gain the highest position
 - c.2. If the teams are still tied after part 1 the team with the best goals against average gains the highest position. The goal average is to be determined by the following method:
 - c.2.1. Divide the total number of goals "for" and "against" into the total goals "for"
 - c.2.2. The team with the highest percentage takes the highest position
 - c.3. When the team with the highest position has been determined, revert back to the two-team tie breaking procedure to determine the next highest finisher, if required

Rule 11: Protest

- a. A protest committee appointed by the League Commissioner shall hear protests within 14 days of receipt of the official protest.
- b. All protests shall be in writing and shall outline the specific complaint(s) supported by evidence and signed by the CHL representative of the protesting association. The evidence is statements by game officials, coaches, non-partisan spectators and the game sheet.
- c. The CHL Representative shall file all protests with the League Commissioner within 48 hours of the time of the complaint or infraction, accompanied by a fee of \$75.00. All protests must be forwarded to the commissioner via e-mail
- d. The fee is refundable only if the protest is won.
- e. All protest(s) must follow the guidelines of the OHF and the Alliance.
 - e.1. An appeal, if necessary, shall be in writing or via e-mail and filed with the League Commissioner within 48 hours of the receipt of the protest ruling.
 - e.1.1. The conduct of the hearing shall be at the discretion of the Commissioner.
 - e.1.2. The League Commissioner shall notify the protest committee and the persons involved of the time and the place of the meeting
 - e.1.3. The appeal committee will consist of the Chair, League Commissioner and two executive members selected by the Commissioner

All other complaints must be filed in writing with the Associations CHL representative, who in turn will present the letter of complaint to the League Chair or League Commissioner who will follow up on all complaints and report back to the board on their findings.

Rule 12: Game Changes

- a. It is the intent to have all scheduled games played during the regular season and playoffs. Forfeits are not acceptable and must be approved by the CHL Board of Directors in special circumstances.
- b. All game changes are to be made through the ice scheduler of the association requesting the change using the following procedure:
 - b.1. A request is forwarded to the home association ice scheduler based on the parameters of weather, lack of facilities, bereavement, and tournaments. All other reasons for game changes are not accepted i.e. team parties, birthdays, special events, etc.
 - b.2. The home ice scheduler will contact the visiting team's ice scheduler and a suitable date for re-scheduling the game will be determined based on ice availability and team schedules within the same week.
 - b.3. The respective ice schedulers will contact their own team notifying the respective coaches (conveners if required) of the new date and time.
 - b.4. The home ice scheduler will also contact the London Referee Group assignor, the timekeeper, the Arena staff and the League Statistician advising of the new date and time.
- c. If a team fails to show for a game, the "guilty" association will incur all costs for re-scheduling the game including ice costs, referees and time keepers for both games regardless of who the home association is
- d. The home association convener must notify the visiting association convener within 24 hours of a game not being played
- e. No game may be re-scheduled to accommodate the serving of a suspension assessed to any player or coach.

Rule 13: Major Penalties and Suspensions

- a. The most recent OHF Minimum Suspension list will apply. (The list is located on the Alliance website, Alliance Handbook and also in the CHL Coach's Manual)
- b. Head check suspensions will apply as per OHF minimum suspension list & MHAO rules
- c. The CHL Commissioner may add to any minimum suspension

Rule 14: Fighting

The penalized player will also receive a suspension as indicated by the OHF minimum suspension list and the MHAO fighting progression rules.

Rule 15: Suspensions

- a. The League Commissioner shall administer suspensions for Major, Misconduct, and Match penalties
- b. Any player, coach, manager, or person in charge of a team receiving a match penalty shall be automatically suspended until further notice
 - b.1. The suspended party may not practice or associate with the team until the suspension is assessed
 - b.2. After the suspension has been assessed the suspended party may attend practices but will not participate in any league, tournament, or exhibition games until the full suspension has been served
- c. All suspensions must be served in league, playoff, or tournament games. Exhibition games do not qualify for games served against the suspension
- d. Any player, coach, manager, or person in charge of the team receiving a gross misconduct penalty shall be automatically suspended as per the OHF suspension list. All gross misconduct penalties are now subject to review by the Executive Director of the Alliance.
- e. No member of the Board of Directors shall be eligible to participate in a hearing on a suspension or a hearing involving the association in which he or she represents
- f. It is the responsibility of the coach to know if he has a player, manager or assistant suspended. If unsure, the coach must contact their convenor before the suspected party participates in any league, tournament or exhibition game
 - If a player participates in a game while subject to suspension the following penalties will apply:
 - g.1. A first offence will result in the coach being suspended for three (3) games and/or a forfeit of the game(s)
 - g.2. A second offence will result in a one year suspension from the date of the subsequent offence, with the right to appeal and a forfeit of any games
 - g.3. A game cannot be changed or added to lessen the suspension

Rule 16: Hockey Sticks

All sticks must have a knob on the end of the handle. It must be large enough that it cannot get through a facemask

Rule 17: Game Periods

- a. The Major Novice to Juvenile divisions shall consist of 10/10/15 minute periods
- b. The Minor Novice division shall consist of 10/10/16 minute periods
- c. All periods are stop time
- d. Curfews for all games are to be established prior to the start of the game and noted on the game sheet

Rule 18: Penalty Minutes

Any player receiving 3 minor penalties shall be ejected from the game.

Rule 19 A: Minor Novice Division

- a. The timekeeper will sound the horn at two-minute intervals to stop the play
- b. All coaches must adhere to the CHL equal ice guidelines (see Rule 1: Equal Ice Time)
 - b.1. Coaches must use the 5 in 5 out rule for changing lines
 - b.2. All players will exit the player's bench from the doors closest to the center red line and all players will enter the bench from the doors closest to the blue line
- c. **Double Shifting**: No player may play in two consecutive shifts, even on the last shift of the game, or miss more than two consecutive shifts except:
 - c.1. When a team has less than 10 skaters, the players must be rotated equally
 - All teams must keep their line change sheets with their copy of the game sheet
- e. CHL Board members may inspect the line change sheets at any time
- f. CHL monitoring of line changes and equal ice time can take place at any time during the season
- g. Penalties: All penalties will expire at the end of each shift
- h. Teams are to switch ends at the end of each period as per HC rules
- i. In case of an injury the player replacing the injured player must come from the following line. This will not count as a double shift as said player can play with his original line.
- j. When a goalie is pulled for the extra attacker, a player from the next line can be used until the goalie is put back in. This player can go out with his original line and this is not considered a double shift.

Rule 19 B: Major Novice Division

a. Major Novice will ONLY use the two-minute buzzer until the 1st Monday in December

Rule 20: Coaches on the Ice (Novice Division only)

One coach per team may assist the players on the ice to line up for face-offs up until the first Monday in December. At no time are the coaches allowed to interfere when the puck is in play.

Rule 21: Schedules and Playoffs

- a. Schedule will be the responsibility of the CHL Board of Directors and will be published and distributed to member associations as soon as possible
- b. Playoffs will be held at the end of the regular schedule and arranged annually by the CHL Board of Directors
- c. The tentative playoff format will be decided at the CHL regularly scheduled January meeting
- d. The playoff schedule is not subject to change without CHL Board approval
- e. All coaches should contact their association CHL Rep prior to the playoff meeting to block out questionable dates
- f. The CHL will procure suitable awards to be presented to the players on the League Championship teams and the Final Playoff Championship teams.

Rule 22: Championship Weekend Rules

- a. Following are the rules that apply to all championship weekend games:
- b. All rules from the regular season apply in the championship weekend games with the exception of game officials for Minor Midget, Midget and Juvenile where 3 carded officials may be scheduled at the discretion of the CHL Board.
- c. All teams must be prepared to play 15 minutes prior to your scheduled starting time.
- d. The teams will line up to shake hands at the beginning of each game.
- e. All games will be 13 10 10 minute periods with no curfew. The clock will start when the referee's step on the ice, the buzzer will sound at the 11 minute mark for the teams to line up and shake hands, and will not stop until the first stoppage in play. The winners of the semi-final games will advance to the championship game.
- f. Tie Breaker Rules:

The following rules will apply to break a tie in all non-curfew games:

- f.1. Players (except for Minor Novice) serving a penalty at the end of regulation time continue to serve the balance of the penalty in the overtime period.
- f.2. There will be a 5 minute sudden victory period. The Minor Novice division overtime will be played in three 2 minute intervals.
- f.3. Each team, except Minor Novice, will ice (4) players and a goalie at the start of the overtime period less any penalized players.
- f.4. Players can be freely rotated between clock stoppages, except for the **Minor Novice Division where the 5 in 5 out** rule still applies at 2 minute buzzer intervals. The 5 in 5 out rotation of players will continue to the conclusion of the game (including the overtime period).
- f.5. If still tied at the end of the overtime period a shootout will take place. Each team will identify three shooters and two alternates prior to the game. The shooters will shoot at the same time and the team with the highest total after three shooters will be declared the winner. If it is still tied, the shootout continues utilizing the remaining players on the bench with the first team to score without the other team scoring will be declared the winner. All skaters must shoot prior to any player taking a second shot. Any player in the penalty box at the start of the shoot out is ineligible for the shootout.
- g. Time outs will not be permitted.

NOTE: Community Hockey League representatives will be on hand during the course of the weekend to monitor games to ensure rules are adhered to.

Rule 23: Bench Rule

- a. No one shall be on the bench during a game other than rostered coaches, managers, trainers and players in full uniform.
- b. All team officials must be a minimum of 16 years old and be at least (2) years older than the players.

Rule 24: Travel Permits

- a. All exhibition games and tournaments must be played with approved travel permits from their association.
- b. Each association will supply a spreadsheet of issued travel permits upon request
- c. No travel permits will be issued for any team during Championship Weekend or beyond until their team has been eliminated from the playoffs.

Rule 25: Blood Rule

- a. A referee, player, coach or member of the coaching staff who is bleeding or has blood on their uniform and / or equipment cannot participate until such time that the bleeding is controlled and the uniform and / or equipment is changed or removed
- b. The trainer will be responsible for treating the injured participant and ensuring that there is no blood in the bench area. If there is blood in the bench area, the trainer may leave at the next stoppage of play to retrieve cleaning materials
- c. The rule is strict and refers to any amount of blood
- d. If the referee notices any blood anywhere, he/she will send the player or participant to be treated and have the equipment and / or clothing cleaned and changed
- e. If the player bleeds on a jersey and an identical replacement is not available, any other color other than the opposing teams color maybe substituted. The changes must be noted on the game sheet

Rule 26: Affiliated Player Rule

- a. Affiliated players must be listed on an approved A/P form and submitted to the associations' division convener and their CHL representative
- b. It is the responsibility of each association to track their A/P players and submit A/P usage at the monthly CHL meeting.
- c. A coach may call on an Affiliated player which can only be used to replace rostered players and only to a maximum of 10 skaters The affiliated goalie may only play in the case of an injury/illness of the regular goalie or in a case where the regular goalie is unable to attend the scheduled game
- d. Affiliated players must be drawn from either across the division or from the division immediately below, within your **own** association
- e. Skaters can only A/P to one CHL team.
- f. To call up an affiliated player, a coach must contact and obtain permission from:
 - f.1. the association convenor
 - f.2. the player's coach
 - f.3. the player's parent
- g. A coach must give permission unless:
 - g.1. there are conflicting games
 - g.2. there is less than three hours between games
 - g.3. there are previously scheduled tournaments and or exhibition games
- h. The Affiliated player must be identified as such on the travel permit and or game sheets.
- i. Infraction of this rule will have the player removed from all CHL A/P lists and both coaches to be suspended for one game with the game being re-scheduled within six days at the offending team's cost.

Rule 27: Handshakes

All players from each team will line up at center ice and shake hands at the beginning of each CHL game

ALLIANCE CODE OF CONDUCT

The Code of Conduct identifies the standard of behaviour which is expected of all ALLIANCE members and participants, which for the purpose of this policy shall include all players, guardians, parents, coaches, officials, volunteers, directors, officers, committee members, convenors, team managers, trainers, administrators, referees and employees involved in ALLIANCE activities and events.

The ALLIANCE is committed to providing an environment in which all individuals are treated with respect. Members and participants of the ALLIANCE shall conduct themselves at all times in a manner consistent with the values of the ALLIANCE which include fairness, integrity and mutual respect.

During the course of all ALLIANCE activities and events, members and participants shall avoid behaviour which brings the ALLIANCE or the sport of hockey into disrepute, including but not limited to abusive use of alcohol, use of non-medical drugs and use of alcohol by minors.

The ALLIANCE members and participants shall at all times adhere to the ALLIANCE's operational policies and procedures, to rules and regulations governing ALLIANCE events and activities, and to rules and regulations governing any competitions in which the member participates on behalf of the ALLIANCE.

Members and participants of the ALLIANCE shall not engage in any activity or behaviour which interferes with a competition or with any player or team's preparation for a competition, or which endangers the safety of others.

Members of the ALLIANCE shall refrain from comments or behaviours which are disrespectful, offensive, abusive, racist or sexist. In particular, behaviour which constitutes harassment or abuse will not be tolerated, and with be dealt with accordingly.

Failure to comply with this Code of Conduct may result in disciplinary action in accordance with the Discipline Policy of the ALLIANCE. Such action may result in the member losing the privileges which come with membership in the ALLIANCE, including the opportunity to participate in ALLIANCE activities and events, both present and future.



GLHA Coaches' and Volunteer Agreement

We are please to offer you a coaching/manager/trainer position with the Forest City/House League Division. The terms and conditions of this offer are outlined below and your signature indicates your acceptance of these terms and conditions.

I commit to the following coaching principles and standards:

- 1. To build self-esteem among my players.
- 2. To show leadership by always taking responsibility for my actions.
- 3. To ensure the proper conduct of all players and team officials on and off the ice at any function.
- 4. To learn and follow the rules of the game, the rules and by-laws of the Ontario Hockey Alliance/Forest City/Community

 League and the rules and by-laws of my home association.
- 5. To be responsible for the association's equipment and sweaters and return all in good condition at the end of the season on the assigned date.
- 6. To support the principles of fair play.
- 7. To offer only constructive criticism.
- 8. To always treat players with dignity and respect.
- 9. To teach players that the officials are an important part of the game and that their decisions should be respected at all times.
- 10. To encourage players to be modest in victory and good sport's in defeat.
- 11. To remind the players that a medal or trophy is not the only measure of success.
- 12. To ensure that all players receive fair playing time regardless of their relative abilities.
- 13. To ensure that all players receive equal attention to ensure proper player development.
- 14. To ensure that all players are equipped with proper approved equipment.
- 15. To be aware of alcohol and drug policies.

- 16. To maintain a positive and open relationship with all players and their parents.
- 17. To be respectful of all other Coaches and members of my Home Association.
- 18. To be respectful to other teams and their players and personnel.
- 19. To report to my convenor any conduct observed or committed that reflects negatively on either my team or my Home Association.
- 20. To never offer any player money, gifts or any material incentive in connection with their involvement in the hockey program.
- 21. To never permit myself to become sexually or intimately involved with any player in the hockey program or to touch any player in a manner which could be reasonably interpreted as being sexual or intimate in nature.
- 22. To ensure that there is always more than one adult present in the dressing room when players are present.

I have/have not (please circle the appropriate response) been convicted and/or found guilty of a criminal offence against a person. I will consent to a Criminal Record Search and will sign the appropriate forms when requested. I will undertake to immediately advise the Convenor of whatever details they may require concerning my convictions(s). I understand and agree that the Board of Directors may withdraw this offer if they view that it would not be in the best interest of the Greater London Hockey Association or my Home Association to hold a coaching position.

I further understand that the Greater London Hockey Association or my Home Association has the right to apply discipline that they feel is appropriate if I do not follow the above listed principles and standards. Any disciplinary action taken by the Board can be appealed.

I have been given a copy of this agreement, have read and understand the terms and have had the opportunity to obtain independent legal advice.
